

Famous People from the State of Alabama

Condoleezza Rice - Condoleezza Rice is an American diplomat who served as the 66th United States Secretary of State under President George W. Bush. She was the first African American women to serve as Secretary of State.

John Lewis – Civil Rights Activist and U.S. Congressman.

Helen Keller – Helen Keller was the first deaf and blind woman who became famous for her writing, being a political activist, and a lecturer.

Jessie Owens – Jessie Owens won 4 gold medals in the 1936 Berlin Olympics track and field competitions. In 1983, he was inducted in the US Olympic Hall of Fame. He has to his credit two U.S. postage stamps, issued in 1990 and 1998.

Rosa Parks - Rosa Louise McCauley Parks was an American civil rights activist. She was also known as the 'mother of the freedom movement' and 'the first lady of civil rights'.

Joe Louis - Joe Louis was a heavyweight boxing champion, who held the title of 'World Heavyweight Champion' for longer than anyone else in his era.

Channing Tatum - Channing Tatum is an American actor.

Harper Lee - Harper Lee was an American author who is renowned for her novel 'To Kill a Mockingbird'.

Courtney Cox - Courtney Cox is an American actress, director, and producer. She is best known for her role in the TV series 'Friends'.

Lionel Richie – Lionel Richie is a Grammy Award-recipient. He is considered one of the most successful singer-songwriters of the 20th century. Some of his hits are: 'Hello', 'Truly', 'Three Times A Lady' and 'Say You, Say Me'.

Tim Cook – An executive who succeeded Steve Jobs as the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of Apple Inc.

Charles Barkley – Barkley played professionally for 16 years for three different NBA teams: Philadelphia 76ers, Phoenix Suns, and Houston Rockets.

Nat King Cole - The first African-American performer to host a variety TV show. He was also an excellent singer, pianist, and head of the band, 'King Cole Trio'. He first gained fame as a jazz pianist.

Emmie Lou Harris - Emmylou Harris is a singer and songwriter who has won 13 Grammy Awards.

Coretta Scott King - Coretta Scott King was an American civil rights activist and the wife of Martin Luther King Jr.

Mae Jemison - Mae Jemison is an American physician and former astronaut for the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA). She was the first African American woman to travel to space.

Satchel Paige - First African American pitcher in the American League and the seventh Negro big leaguer. Satchel Paige also played in Major League Baseball for five years.

Octavia Spencer - Octavia Spencer is an African American actress, author and film producer.

Jim Nabors – American Actor famous for his role in the Andy Griffith and The Gomer Pyle shows.

Hank Williams – Hank Williams was a great country singer. His hit records included 'Cold, Cold Heart', 'Your Cheatin' Heart', 'Hey, Good Lookin' and 'I'll Never Get Out of This World Alive'.
