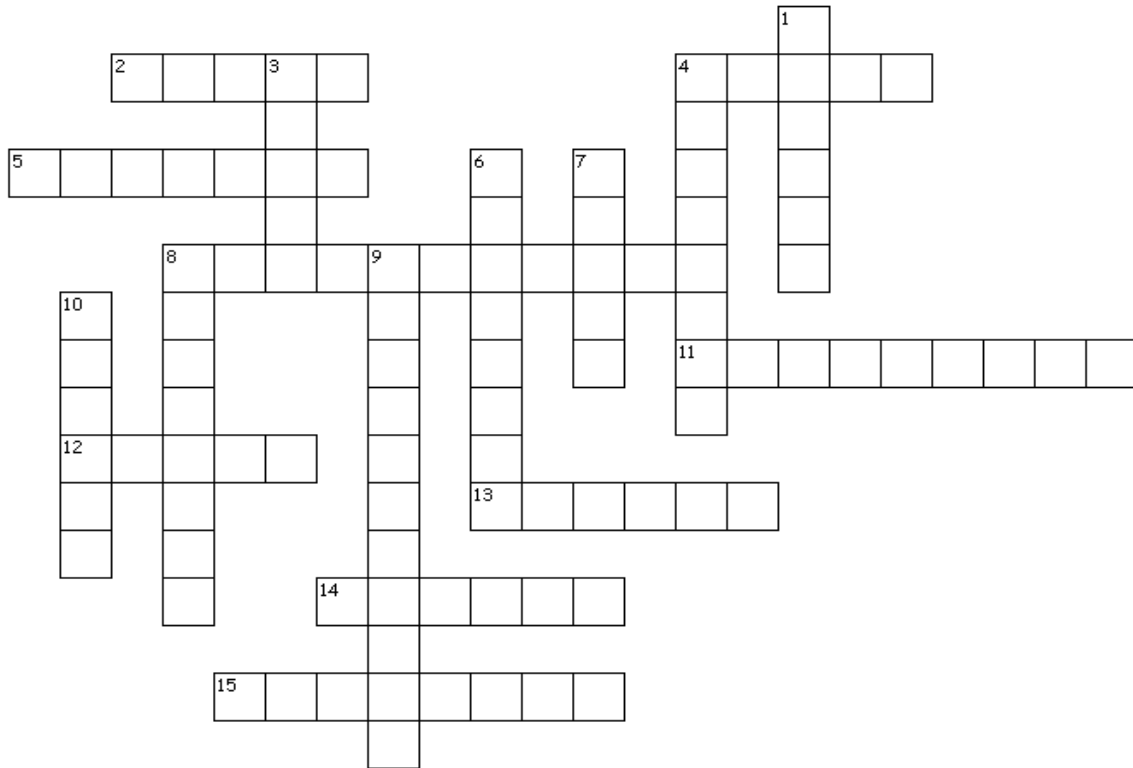

The Hoover Dam, completed in 1935 and named after President Herbert Hoover.

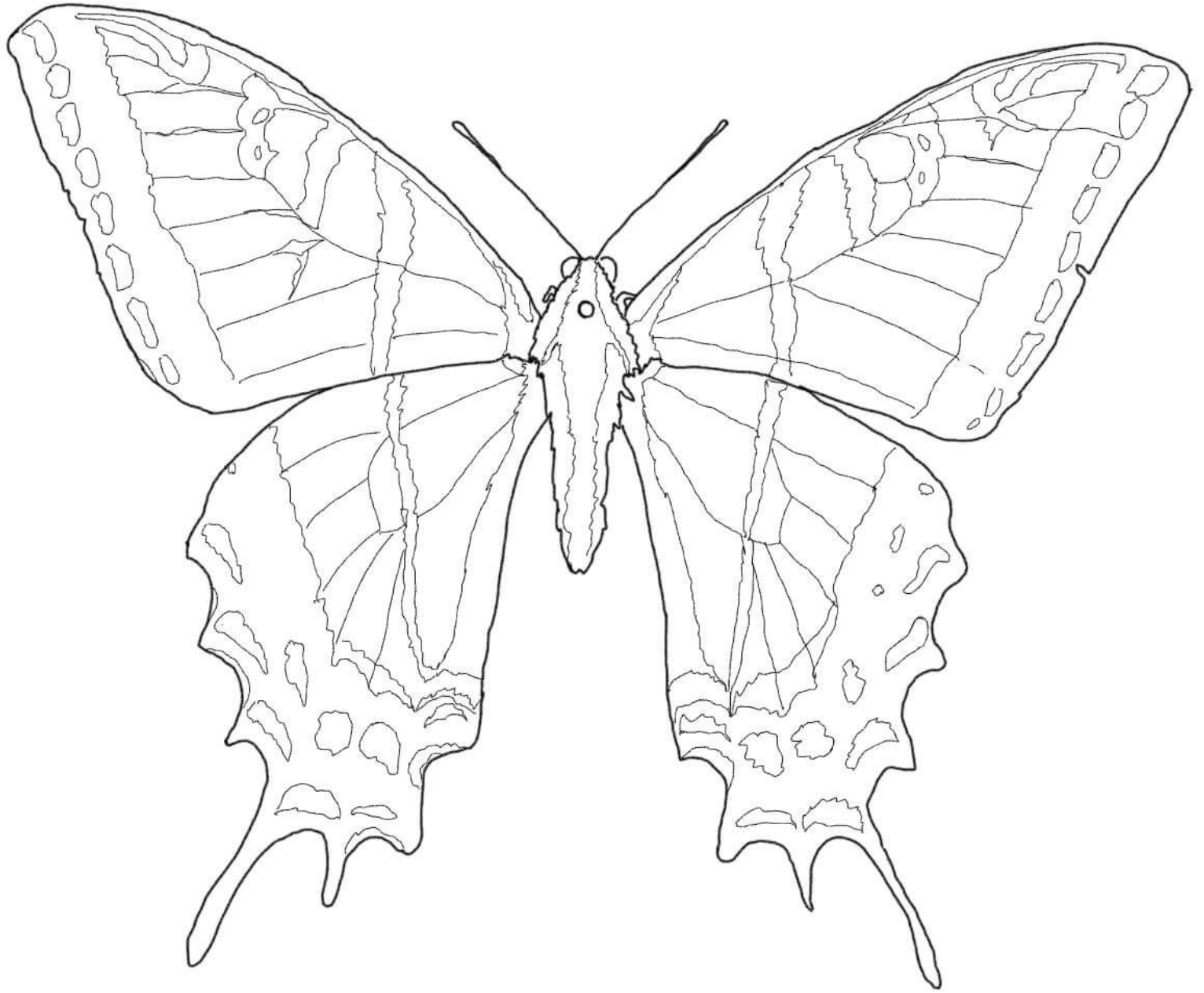
Some of the Indian tribes in Arizona are the Apache, Maricopa, Mohave, Navajo, and Yuma.

Arizona has 13 species of rattlesnakes.

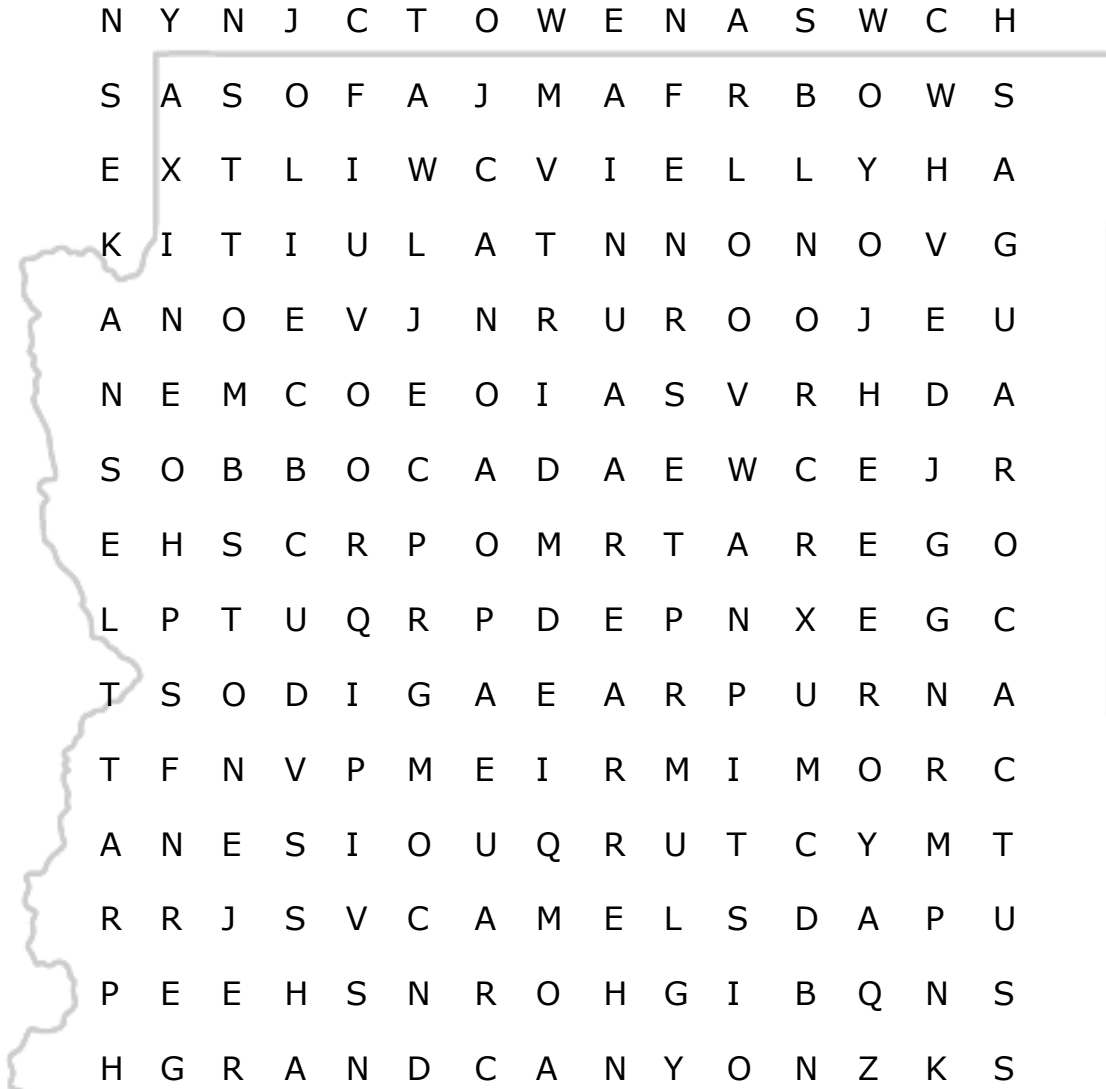

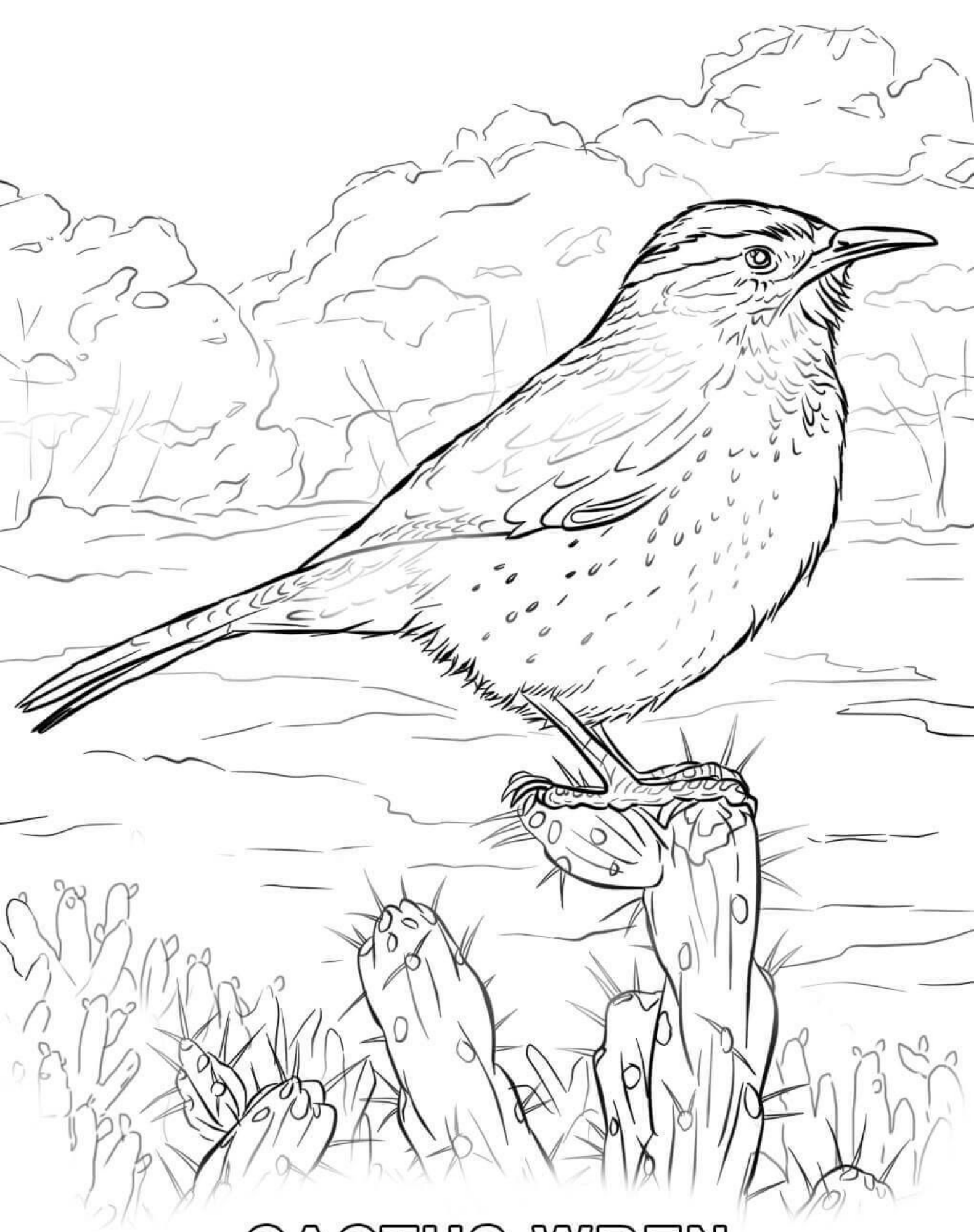
