



# Bird Watching for Kids Carolina Wren

- Carolina Wrens are small reddish brown birds.
- Males and Females look identical.
- Carolina Wrens visit feeders in the winter to enjoy suet, seeds and nuts.



#### White-breasted Nuthatch

- Males and females look almost identical.
- Offer them sunflower seeds, peanut chips, peanut butter, mealworms, and suet.
- Nuthatches flock with chickadees and titmice.
- They store seeds in tree bark.




#### Bird Watching for Kids American Goldfinch

- Adult males are bright yellow, black and white in the spring and summer. They turn a dull yellow in the fall and winter.
- Females are a muted yellow.
- Goldfinches fly with a bouncy pattern.
- They also love nyjer and black oil sunflower seeds at feeders.




# Bird Watching for Kids Blue Jays

- Blue Jays are large songbirds with blue, white and black feathers.
- The males and females look identical.
- Blue Jays hold peanuts with their claws to eat them.
- They love acorns, shelled peanuts, and sunflower seeds.




# Bird Watching for Kids Common Grackle

- Common Grackles are longer and taller than black birds.
- They walk around lawns and fields foraging.
- They travel in large flocks and roost in trees.
- They come to feeders to eat grain and seeds.



# Bird Watching for Kids Downy Woodpecker

- Male has a red patch on its head.
- Feathers are black with white spots.
- Downy Woodpeckers love suet, sunflower seed and peanuts hearts.




#### Female Gardinal

- Female Northern Cardinals are a light brown with red tinge.
- The male Northern Cardinal is a bright red.
- Females sing in the spring before building a nest.
- Cardinals eat sunflower, safflower, cracked corn, peanut hearts and milo.



#### Grey Cat Bird

- Male and female catbirds look identical.
- · They fly short distances.
- Catbirds love sliced apples, cherries, soaked raisins, suet and sunflower hearts.
- Catbirds migrate to warm climates during the winter, but they will return in the spring.



# Bird Watching for Kids Howe Finch

- Adult males are rosy red around the face and upper breast. They have a streaky brown back.
- · The females are streaky brown.
- · House Finches love fruit.
- They also love nyjer, black oil sunflower seeds, peanut kernels and suet.



### Bird Watching for Kids Morthern Gardinal

- Cardinals are one of the most popular birds.
- The male Northern Cardinal is bright red. He gets his color from berries.
- Males feed the females when courting.
- Cardinals love sunflower and safflower seeds at feeders.




#### Yellow Shaft Morthern Flicker

- Northern Flickers are large woodpeckers.
- Male and female Northern
   Flickers look alike. The female doesn't have the black mark on her face.
- Offer suet, corn, sunflower seeds, peanuts or grapes at your feeder on a large tree.




Red-bellied Woodpecker

- Red-bellied Woodpeckers are medium sized birds.
- · Male have a red head and nape.
- The female doesn't have the red dhead.
- Red-bellied woodpeckers love suet, peanuts in the shell and out, safflower and sunflower seeds. They may also eat apples.




Rose-Greated Grosbeak

- Males are black and white with a red mark on the breast.
- Females are brown streaked.
- Rose-breasted Grosbeaks visit feeders in the spring an fall to eat sunflower hearts, safflower seeds, cracked corn and fruit.




#### Tufted Tit-mouse

- Small grey bird with a crest.
- · Male and female look identical.
- Love sunflower seeds, peanuts, suet and safflower seeds.
- Tufted Tit-mouse store most of their seeds during the winter.
- Stay in the area where they are born.



# Bird Watching for Kids Male Mallard

- · Only female mallards quack.
- Mallards like ponds, lakes, swamps, marshes and parks.
- Nests are made in flower beds, roadside ditches or roofs.
- Mallards eat wheat, barley, birdseed, and chopped lettuce and vegetables.



## Bird Watching for Kids Red-winged Black Bird

- Males are black with yellow and red shoulders.
- Red-winged Blackbirds like fresh and salt water marshes, wet roadsides, crop fields and pastures.
- They will come to feeders, but spread grain or seed on the ground.
